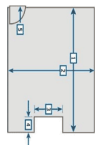

## Workshops

### Crime Scene Documentation:

Ryan M. Rezzelle and Rebecca Vincent-Giles, Johnson County SO



This workshop will cover the basic components of documenting any type of crime scene; from simple steps such as collecting basic notes on the scene to gathering elaborate measurements for the creation of computerized diagrams. A thorough look at documentation techniques will be covered, including: notes, photos, measurements and diagramming, GPS & GIS, 3-D laser scanning, and converting field notes into a report.

### Trace and DNA Collection:

Kevin Winer, Kansas City, MO PD and James Newman, Kansas Bureau of Investigation



This workshop will cover trace and touch DNA collection. Trace collection will cover topics including hair, fibers, paint, glass, tape, plastics, lubricants, physical matches, trace metal detection and lamp examinations. A discussion on the Combined Offender DNA Index System (CODIS) will also be covered.

### Footwear, Tire Track and Latent Print Collection:

Troy Mohror, Johnson County SO and Jacqueline Hayworth, Kansas Bureau of Investigation



This workshop will cover the collection of footwear and tire track evidence, utilizing photography and casting techniques and the basic development and collection of latent prints. The workshop will expound on latent fingerprint, footwear and tire track report wording.

### Cellphone and Data Recovery:

Dean Brown and MT Brown, Lawrence PD, and Jeff Owen, Missouri State Highway Patrol



This workshop will cover an overview of cellular technology and the forensics applications used in the acquisition, reporting and analyzing of data. There will be hands-on training on the use of Secure View 3 extraction software, provided by Susteen, Inc.

## *Jodi Sanderholm*



Jodi Sanderholm, a member of the Cowley College dance team, was last seen alive January 5, 2006 as she left her dance team's practice. The search for Jodi lasted four days, when her body was discovered in Kaw Wildlife Area. Justin Thurber, not unknown to the police department and the dance team members, was linked to Jodi's murder. Thurber was found guilty of capital murder and aggravated kidnapping. Since Jodi's death, her family has been very active in changing legislation in creating Jodi's law and creating awareness about stalking. A memorial has been erected in the Kaw Wildlife Area in Jodi's honor and that area is now named the Jodi LeAnn Sanderholm Wildlife Area.

Senior Special Agent David Falletti started his law enforcement career in 1996, with the Riley County Police Department in Manhattan, Kansas after serving with the United States Army. He was initially assigned as a patrol officer for this county wide law enforcement agency and was later promoted to detective in the Investigations Division. As a detective, SSA Falletti investigated numerous cases which mainly focused on juvenile crimes and child deaths.

After obtaining his bachelor's degree in Public Administration, Falletti was hired, in 2001, by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation, stationed in Liberal, Kansas covering a six-county area. In 2004, Falletti was transferred to the Wichita Region and currently covers Cowley, Butler, and Sumner Counties.

In his capacity with the KBI, SSA Falletti has worked numerous cases involving homicide, officer involved shootings, child abuse, public corruption, and financial crimes. Along with his other duties, Falletti currently serves as a Firearms Instructor and is a Region 7 Governor for the Kansas Peace Officer's Association.

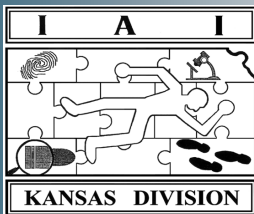
