

Permanence-Track Position Learning Specialist, Ancillary Academic Staff I or II in the Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences

The Faculty of Science at the University of Windsor invites applications for a Permanence-Track Learning Specialist, Ancillary Academic Staff I or II position in the area of Forensic Science, commencing July 1, 2019. The successful candidate will hold a primary appointment in the Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences, with a hybrid-appointment in the Forensic Sciences Program in the Dean's Office. The latter hybrid-appointment will be for an initial period of five years, and may be renewed. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.

The Forensic Science program is supported by faculty in a variety of departments across the University. The Faculty of Science has strong research programs in all areas of natural science, mathematics and computer science. The incumbent will have access to state-of-the-art forensic facilities, and will be expected to interact with other departments to support undergraduate projects in forensic science.

The successful candidate must have an M.Sc, Ph.D., or equivalent professional experience in an appropriate discipline. The ability to develop and teach forensic science courses is essential, and university teaching experience is desirable. Candidates must have training and professional experience in the field of forensic science or crime scene investigation, preferably in a forensic laboratory setting, forensic science investigation unit, or as a qualified independent forensic consultant. Additional practical experience in physical or chemical analysis is desirable. Evidence of commitment to excellence in teaching is required.

The incumbent will instruct courses in the area of crime scene investigation including, but not limited to, the scientific theory of crime scene investigation, crime scene protocol, crime scene reconstruction, and evidence processing techniques. Both online and traditional classroom teaching will be supported. Support and mentorship of undergraduate research projects, internships, or practicums, as well as managing the Crime Scene Condo, teaching and research laboratories and all associated technology and equipment associated with Forensic Science, are included in the incumbent's responsibilities.

Application Requirements

- a letter of application, including a statement of citizenship/immigration status;
- a detailed curriculum vitae;
- a two (2) page outline of forensic practice, research, scholarly, and/or pedagogical interests and accomplishments;
- a teaching dossier or teaching portfolio showing a potential for or evidence of teaching effectiveness and excellence. This may include sample instructional syllabi/outlines, teaching evaluations, and a statement of teaching philosophy and interests. - graduate transcripts, professional certifications, or other evidence of professional qualifications; and
- three (3) current letters of reference forwarded directly by the referees to the Dean of Science at the address or email listed below. At least one letter from a professional mentor or supervisor is highly recommended.

Only those applicants selected for interview will be contacted. The short-listed candidates may be invited to provide further information in support of their applications.
