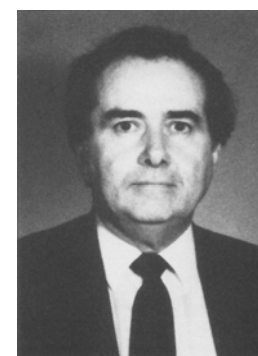

The Johnson-Whyte Memorial Foundation Fund

Johnson-Whyte Memorial Foundation Fund

The International Association for Identification (I.A.I.) has established a charitable foundation fund whose purpose is to promote education and research in the disciplines of forensic identification through the award of scholarships and grants to worthy applicants. The Johnson-Whyte Memorial Foundation Fund was formed when the R.L. Johnson and the William White Foundations were consolidated into a singular foundation fund in 2008.

The Robert L. Johnson Foundation was established in memory of Robert L. Johnson, of the U.S. Secret Service, who was instrumental in the formation of the I.A.I. Latent Print Certification Board and served as its first Chairman. He was an active member of the I.A.I. for 18 years and was serving as the Second Vice President of the I.A.I. at the time of his death. The purpose of the Robert L. Johnson Foundation was to promote the advancement and growth of Forensic Identification as a profession by offering financial grants for college scholarships and other educational and research projects consistent with the purposes of the I.A.I.

The I.A.I. and Helen Whyte, widow of William Whyte, recognizing the need for increased participation at the Annual Educational Conferences by the members outside of the host country, established the "William Whyte Foundation," instituted in memory of William Whyte, of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, who died as the result of a heart attack suffered while serving on the I.A.I. Board of Directors at the 1998 I.A.I. Annual Educational Conference. The purpose of the Foundation

was to provide educational grants to members of the I.A.I. who live and work outside of the host country to assist them in attending the I.A.I.

The merged fund reflects the goals and objectives of the former foundations and is in a better fiduciary position to accomplish them.

Contributions

This fund is a self-sustaining research and scholarship fund. As such, all contributions are held in perpetuity and only income from investments is made available for scholarship and grant awards.

Donation Recognition

All contributions are cumulative and will be recognized as follows:

Fellow

All individuals who contribute \$500 in a lump sum or cumulatively, shall be designated as Fellow and shall receive a lapel pin and certificate of recognition.

Ruby Level Fellow

All individuals who contribute \$1,000 in a lump sum or cumulatively, shall be designated as a Ruby Level Fellow and shall receive a jeweled lapel pin and certificate of recognition.

Diamond Level Fellow
