Position Description:

The [School of Interdisciplinary Forensics](#) (SIF) at Arizona State University (ASU) invites applications for full-time, benefits-eligible, non-tenure-eligible faculty positions at the rank of Professor of Practice to teach undergraduate and graduate courses in forensic science. Salary is based on qualifications and rank at hire. The start date is August 2026 semester.

Professors of Practice contribute their extensive industry experience to teaching, service, and research as determined by School leadership and based on the needs of the program.

About the School:

SIF offers a unique approach to forensic education, offering students transdisciplinary ways to learn about how technology and science interact with law, legal systems, and legal issues. SIF has strengths in the psychological sciences (social, clinical, developmental psychology, and psychology and law); the natural sciences (anthropology, biology, chemistry, entomology, and genetics); and information technology (cybersecurity, digital forensics). Essential Functions of the Position:

- Teach forensic science courses to undergraduate and/or graduate students in face-to-face, hybrid, or online formats.
- Prepare course syllabi, lectures, learning exercises, exams, and other course materials, and grade assignments and assessments.
- Develop, maintain, and update course materials as appropriate to the field and modality.
- Maintain regular availability to students, including office hours as appropriate to course modality.
- Monitor student success and regularly respond to student academic issues.

- Coordinate regular communication with ASU Online ancillary support services and graduate student teaching assistants.
- Participate in service to the school, college, university, community, and/or profession as requested.
- Engage in regular professional development.
- Foster collegiality throughout the organization.
- Complete periodic mandatory training.

Required Qualifications:

- An earned bachelor's degree in forensic science or a closely related scientific field (e.g., biology, chemistry, physics, physical anthropology); and
- At least ten years of distinguished professional experience in forensic science practice.

Desired Qualifications:

- An earned master's or doctoral degree in forensic science or a closely related scientific field (e.g., biology, chemistry, physics, physical anthropology, criminology, psychology, etc.);
- Experience working in public or private settings in a forensic scientific field;
- Two or more semesters of teaching experience at the undergraduate and/or graduate levels either online or in-person;
- Demonstrated commitment to working successfully with students from a wide variety of socio-economic and cultural backgrounds, including first-generation college students;
- Evidence of teaching effectiveness as demonstrated by one or more of the following: student evaluations, peer evaluations, annual performance evaluations, prior course syllabi, etc.;
- Experience with technology/course management systems such as Canvas; and
- Demonstrated excellent English written and verbal communication skills.

Application Deadline:

The initial application deadline is **February 18, 2026, at 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time. Applications will continue to be accepted on a rolling basis for a reserve pool.** Applications in the reserve pool may then be reviewed in the order in which they were received until the position is filled and/or the search is closed. Application Procedure:

Only electronic submissions via Interfolio will be reviewed. All required materials must be submitted at the time of initial application. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Please submit all application materials to <https://apply.interfolio.com/180846>

Applications must contain:

- A letter of application/cover letter of no more than two pages in length that addresses the required and desired qualifications and how your experience will demonstrate the ASU Charter;

- Curriculum vitae or résumé with contact information, including telephone number and e-mail address;
- One-page statement of teaching philosophy; and
- Information for three professional references (including their positions, titles, e-mail addresses, and phone numbers); one reference must be from the applicant's current employer.

Applicants advancing to the second round of review may be asked to provide additional materials.

ASU conducts pre-employment screening for all positions which includes a criminal background check, verification of work history, academic credentials, licenses, and certifications. Employment is contingent upon the successful passing of the background check.
