Job Summary

The Department of Natural, Social, and Behavioral Science at Edward Waters University invites applicants for a full-time faculty appointment as Coordinator of the 3+1 Police Academy Program /Assistant Professor of Law and Criminal Justice starting in Spring 2024. The successful candidate will teach six semester hours in criminal justice/law and be responsible for the management of the 3+1 Police Academy Program. The faculty member will be expected to engage and be proficient in curriculum development, academic mentoring, scholarly activities, institutional service, and build partnerships with local high schools, the police academy, and other law enforcement agencies. This position is grant-funded.

Responsibilities

- Teach six semester hours each semester.
- Act as a EWU liaison between the student and the police academy at FSCJ.
- Develop and maintain partnerships with local high schools and two-year colleges.
- Assisting student/police academy candidates with the application process and paperwork needed for the police academy
- Provide students with student information, paperwork, and authorization for the police academy.
- Provide students with guidance and information regarding career research, options, decision-making, goal setting, and job searching.
- Performing program assessment as assigned
- Providing advisement to program students and student organizations
- Participating in university, college, and departmental recruitment and outreach activities
